
Bridging Business and Education for the 21st Century Workforce: A Strategic Plan for Virginia's Career Pathways System

Career Pathways Definition

A career pathway is a series of connected education and training programs and support services that enable individuals to secure employment within a specific industry or occupational sector, and to advance over time to successively higher levels of education or employment in that sector. Each step on a career pathway is designed explicitly to prepare for the next level of employment and education.

Career Pathways Goals

Career pathways deliver success by:

- Providing employers with a connection to a skilled workforce.
- Providing Virginia residents with education and training opportunities to develop and adapt their skills to a changing economy.

Career pathways in Virginia will:

- Align and connect education and training systems with the business community.
- Inform and advise learners and workers about seamless career and training opportunities in key industries.
- Utilize degrees, certificates, diplomas and certifications that are meaningful to employers and portable for individuals to prepare for changing careers.
- Ensure access to postsecondary education by providing all learners with career and educational advising including assistance with college admissions and financial aid.
- Create opportunities for individuals to progress in education and training through articulation agreements to foster smooth transitions to higher levels of education.
- Provide experience based learning including cooperative learning, internships, service learning, or business based projects to foster employability skills.
- Encompass all individuals including K-12 students, postsecondary students, unemployed and underemployed youth and adults, registered apprentices and incumbent workers.
- Provide system flexibility to respond to evolving business needs.
